## 'Tis the Season for Sugar and Spice GINGERBREAD CONTEST AT PIONEER VILLAGE

SATURDAY, NOVEMBER 18, 2023

**There is no theme or fee to participate**, and no requirement that your entry be a house. It could be a barn, water tower or even a space vehicle, as long as it is in keeping with competition rules & procedures. The reason for this event is to showcase your talent and creativity, while having fun in the process.

ENTRY CATEGORIES: Adult Teen (ages 13-18) Youth (ages 9-12) Child (ages 5-8) Registration is required (see attached registration form).

**CONTEST REQUIREMENTS:** All entries must be mounted on a solid base (1/2" plywood is recommended). Adult and Teen entries must be on 18"x18" board, Youth & Child on 15"x15" board. Each entry cannot exceed 24" in height.

**MATERIALS & CONSTRUCTION:** The main structure of your entry must be constructed of at least 70% homemade gingerbread, some of which should be visible. Royal Icing is required. All other decorations should be made of edible materials. <u>Bases</u> can be covered with non-food related materials. Electrical components are allowed as part of your entry, but you must bring/provide your own power source (batteries). Parental guidance is encouraged for youth and child entries in the form of safety in baking and other kitchen tasks.

**JUDGING CRITERIA**: Judging will be done Saturday, November 18 and winners announced at 11:30 am. Judges will be looking at Overall Appearance, Structure, Difficulty Level, Originality/Creativity, Techniques & Skills. All rulings by the judges are independent and final. The Museum and Judges reserve the right to refuse any entry deemed inappropriate.

**DELIVERY OF ENTRIES:** Entries may be delivered on Friday November 17, 5:00 pm to 7:30 pm, or Saturday morning from 7:30 to 8:30 am. Please bring your creation to the Main Building of the museum where it will be displayed and judged. Awards will be announced at 11:30 am. We would like to be able to display the entries at the Museum at least through December 4 if possible.
